If your high school senior is applying for any financial assistance to attend college (need-based scholarships, federal grants or loans), you **MUST** complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). To help you complete this application, Wilson Tech will conduct FAFSA workshops on:

Financial aid representatives from local two and four year colleges will assist both parents and students in completing the FAFSA online. Those parents and students who attended in the past five years left that evening with a **COMPLETED** FAFSA!

While these FAFSA workshops are open to all senior students and parents, not just Tech students, **advance registration is required and seating is limited**. We will guide you in completing the online application available at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Please arrive promptly at 6 pm to have enough time to ask your questions and complete your child's FAFSA.

How to Prepare for FAFSA Workshop at Wilson Tech

To participate in the FAFSA Workshop, you must bring the following information/documentation with you:

Student's Driver's License and Social Security Number

Parents' Social Security Number*

Student's Alien Registration Number if not a U.S. Citizen

W-2 forms and other records of money earned in 2010 for student and parent/s

2010 Federal Income Tax Returns (form 1040/1040A or 1040EZ) for student and parent/s

(If you have not yet filed 2010 taxes, bring student and parent/s 2009 Federal Income Tax Returns and 2009 W-2 forms)

Records of 2010 Untaxed Income (SS, welfare, TANF, and veteran benefits)

Current Account Balance information for student and parent/s cash, savings, checking, investments, and/or business and farm assets

Federal School Codes for each school the student plans to apply to. This information can be obtained from each potential school.

*For clarification on who is considered a parent under the U.S. Department of Education's guidelines for filing a FAFSA, please see page 4 of the "FAFSA on the Web Worksheet" or call 1-800-4FED-AID

How to apply for your PIN

(one parent **and** the child applying for aid need a PIN #; these numbers allow you to sign the FAFSA electronically and access or edit information online; it is fast, secure, and less error prone)

1. Go to www.pin.ed.gov on the web
2. Click on "Apply for a PIN"
3. Follow "The PIN Application Process" this only takes a few minutes
4. Enter personal Information
5. Submit Your PIN Application information
6. Receive confirmation that application was received
7. Make note of your PIN number and your child's PIN number!

FAFSA on the Web Worksheets

The FAFSA Worksheets help you collect the information needed to apply online. These worksheets are not required for completion of the FAFSA, however, most families find them very helpful in gathering information prior to Tech's FAFSA workshop.
